Marriage and Family Therapy Training Program

The M.S. degree in Marriage and Family Therapy leads to state licensure as a MFT. MFTs work with individuals, couples, families, and groups on mental health, behavioral, personal, and/or relational concerns in public, private, not-for-profit agencies, hospitals, and private practice. The average completion time for the master's degree program is 2.5 years.

Accreditation

The MFT master's degree is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education (COAMFTE) with candidacy status.

Advanced Graduate Certificate

Applicants who have earned a Master's Degree in a related mental health field, but who have not completed the requirements for licensure as delineated by the State of Nevada Board of Marriage and Family Therapist Examiners, may complete a course of study designed to comply with the state's requirements. Once admitted, certificate students are viewed by the department as full participants in the department.

Center for Individual, Couple, and Family Therapy (CICFC)

Once students have completed pre-requisite course work and have been approved by faculty, students may begin seeing clients. Students receive intensive supervision of hands-on clinical work which includes the use of videotaping and observation behind one way mirrors in our therapy center, the Center for Individual, Couple, and Family Counseling which serves a diverse population in the surrounding community. Live and video-tape supervision is available.

The clinical work is a core part of the training program, allowing students to synthesize knowledge, skills, use-of-self, and practical research and problem solving abilities to assist clients. To graduate, students must complete 500 supervised clinical, of face-to-face client hours, 40% of which must be done with couples and/or families. This clinical experience prepares students for their post-graduate licensure internship work.

Supervision is provided by AAMFT approved supervisors, supervisor candidates or the equivalent. All faculty members are productive in generating new research in the field and have national and/or international reputations.
